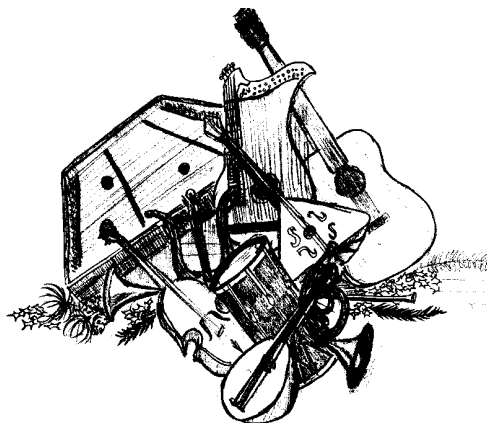

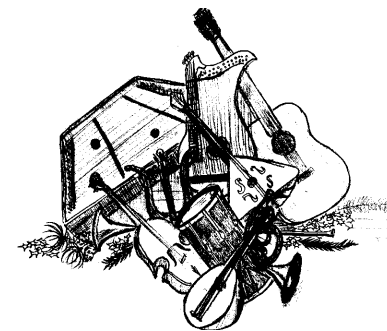

Project Guidelines

Content: All submitted songs must be primarily, and closely based on a checked translation of Psalm 67.

Recordings: All submitted recorded materials will be accepted, although we prefer to receive digital master recordings in any available format (mini-disc, CD, DAT).

Transcriptions: Text should be submitted on a 3.5” floppy diskette in Microsoft Word format (.doc) for PC, and be written in the standard orthography of the region. A back-translation into English is also required. (Please save the document with embedded fonts.) Handwritten transcriptions will also be accepted.

Compensation: All proceeds will be used to further the project (production costs, song-writing contest awards, commissioning songs, etc.). No individual will receive any royalties or proceeds. Any profits will be donated to the work of a minority language Bible Translation project.

Copyright: Permission must be granted for the following: ¹ to use selected songs on a single compilation recording, ² for international performance by a troupe formed for this project, ³ and to post on a project website.

70 Nations Singing 7 Verses of Praise to God

- ♦ to prepare a foretaste of the glorious praise the LORD is preparing for Himself throughout the earth
- ♦ to do Psalm 67:4,6 - “May the peoples praise you, oh God; may all the peoples praise you.”
- ♦ to compile a collection of praise songs from the ends of the earth based exclusively on Psalm 67
- ♦ to encourage the writing of new songs in the “heart music” of newly literate cultures
- ♦ *tentative plan: commissioning original musical compositions based on Psalm 67 (digitally recorded and transcribed - any proceeds to go to the furtherance of the project)*

Why these 7 verses?

- Psalm 67 is representative of the gracious work that God is doing among all the peoples of the earth, in blessing us with His Salvation (יְשׁוּעָה/Yeshua/Jesus).
- The first verse is a direct reference to the High Priestly blessing of Numbers 6:24-26, the oldest extant fragment of scripture (about 700 yrs. older than the Dead Sea Scrolls).
- These verses illustrate the role of God’s chosen people as a light to the nations (Isaiah 42:6; 49:6), a role which Jesus the Messiah identified with and called his disciples to (John 8:12; Matthew 5:14).
- This psalm has been traditionally written in Hebrew in the shape of a menorah (a seven branched lampstand). The menorah which stood in the Temple in Jerusalem was referred to as “the light of the world,” and is the most ancient symbol for the nation of Israel.

Why 70 Nations?

- In Genesis 10 the LORD specifically named 70 individuals, descendants from the 3 sons of Noah, who repopulated the earth after the Flood (representative of all the nations of the earth).
- 70 bulls were sacrificed each year at the Feast of Tabernacles (representing all nations - Numbers 29).
- The LORD revealed Himself on Mt. Sinai to Moses, Aaron and 70 elders as representatives of His priestly people (Exodus 24:9; Numbers 11:25).
- Jesus personally commissioned a group of 70 disciples to go before Him, preaching the good news of the kingdom of God among men (Luke 10:1,17).
